Difficulties in certain subjects, the pressure to achieve high grades, and the fear that they might affect her school admission—all these made her question whether she would succeed.

But then, she realized that despite its challenges, the system offers opportunities. Training programs, projects, and the very possibility of career counseling became valuable tools to help her move forward.

She was not alone on this journey. Her parents were supportive, open to new experiences, and saw career counseling as a crucial step. They didn't push her toward any particular choice but encouraged her to discover for herself what truly fulfilled her.
